Nanny Bea: Hello and welcome, you've made it just in time, the tea is ready and the tale will be here any...

Nanny Bea: minute now.

Nanny Bea: Hello, who is it?

Jules: It's your neighbour Jules, Nanny Bea, I'm here with a story?

Nanny Bea: Yes, it is you, isn't it! Oh hello, come in, come in. I understand you have the most wonderful story for us.

Jules: Oh yes, today's story barely needs an introduction, it has been told for thousands and thousands of years but never grows old. Are you ready for a story?

Nanny Bea: Yes please!

Jules: Okay then, The Nativity Story from the books of Luke and Mathew in the Bible adapted for radio

There is a true story from a time long ago in a land that still exists, of a baby boy born to save the world. For thousands upon thousands of years people spoke of his arrival, of the son of God, coming to take the punishment for all we do wrong, of the one who would give his life to give us life forever on earth and then in heaven. And that baby was to be named Jesus.

Many saw for themselves the birth of our saviour and their reports were gathered together and written down.

It all started with another baby boy being born, one who was to be named John. In the time of King Herod there was a couple who loved God and followed him closely, for years they'd prayed for children but they had none and now they were too old.

One day when it was the turn of old man Zechariah to enter the sanctuary of the temple, a crowd of others gathered outside waiting for him and praying. This was a regular occurrence, coming to the sanctuary to light incense while others prayed outside so they started to get restless when Zechariah stayed in there for so long. And just as God's angel said, Elizabeth, his wife became pregnant and they were so excited. Not long after her cousin Mary was also visited by an angel.

Mary was a young woman engaged to be married to a man named Joseph.

An angel came to her saying, 'Greetings, you who is highly favoured, the Lord is with you.' Mary didn't know what he meant but the angel reassured her, 'Do not be afraid.' Then gave her God's message, 'You will become pregnant and give birth to a son. You are to name Jesus. He will be great, and called 'Son of the Most High', our God. The Lord God will give him the throne and He will rule forever—his kingdom will have no end'

Mary asked the angel, "But how? I've never slept with a man."

They were engaged and before they came to the marriage bed, Joseph discovered Mary was pregnant. Joseph wanted to be faithful to the law which meant he should legally break things off with Mary but he was also kind and decided to do that quietly so Mary wouldn't be shamed publicly.

But after he made his mind up, he had a dream and God's angel spoke to him saying: "Joseph do not hesitate to get married. Mary's pregnancy is Spirit-conceived. God's Holy Spirit has made her pregnant. She will bring a son to birth, and when she does, you, Joseph, will give him the name Jesus, which means 'God saves'—because he will save his people from their sins."

Then Joseph woke up and did exactly what God's angel commanded. He and Mary got married.

They told him, 'In Bethlehem,' adding, 'it is written that from here will come a ruler who will lead God's people.'

Then Herod arranged a secret meeting with the Wisemen from the East and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared to determine when the baby was born. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, 'Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him.'

After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had been following went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. They saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

Although this is the end of the Nativity Story, it's only the beginning of the Jesus Story, the little child meek and mild who gave his all to save the world.
